Among the contents of the artist's studio at his death, with the Böse atelier stamp Nachlass / K. Böse, not in Lugt, stamped on the verso

An unidentified collector's mark, with the letters C(?)K in a circle, not in Lugt, stamped in green ink on the verso.

Artist description:

Relatively little is known of the artist and draughtsman Konrad Böse, who was a follower (and may have been a pupil) of Adolph von Menzel. Böse worked in Berlin and began to establish his reputation around 1885. In 1909 he is known to have exhibited a large number of drawings in Berlin. He was also active as a professor at the Berlin Academy of Arts, where among his pupils was the painter Erich Wolfsfeld.
